SEPTEMBER 2017

It has been a while since GMB Further Education (FE) members and branches received a general communication about what is happening in the FE sector.

This newsletter aims to rectify that and represents the first of regular newsletters keeping you informed and up to date with what's happening across further education along with much more!

This issue covers latest update on FE support staff Pay 2017, organising GMB@Work in FE and a round-up of campaigning in the FE sector.

First, a re-cap on FE support staff pay.

The GMB along with FE joint trade unions submitted this years' pay and conditions claim in March. Staff in FE have now suffered a staggering real terms cut in pay of 21.5% since 2009. For many who work in colleges that have failed to implement the AoC's recommendations, they have lost more than a quarter of their pay over the same period.

Living wage covers a crucial component in the claim. Members told us that working in FE on low wages led employees to take on second jobs, take out loans to make ends meet and some even had to resort to using food banks. GMB, have established policy that they believe that the government's living wage should be set at £10 per hour. It is neither desirable nor necessary for employees in the FE sector to be paid wages that do not afford them a basic, decent standard of living.

Pay talks are at present on-going and GMB, as always, will consult FE support staff separately

The joint trade unions' pay and conditions claim for 201718 includes:

Cost of living claim:

- RPI, as of 1 August 2017, plus 3% on all pay points with a minimum uplift of £900
- Foundation living wage to be the minimum wage for and FE colleges to become accredited living wage employers

Workloads:

 A minimum CPD entitlement for all staff of 30 hours

Class size:

• A nationally agreed policy that specifies appropriate maximum class sizes be primarily and fundamentally based on educational considerations and not overridden by financial ones

Agency staff:

 A nationally agreed policy that specifies that agency staff should only be used for emergency cover in respect of all staffing groups

Campaigning in the Further Education Sector

Joint work together with the Association of Colleges (AoC) has brought the importance of FE to the attention of government and the nation.

FE is accepted across the political spectrum as being central to the UK's success in addressing the economic and skills challenges that BREXIT brings. £170 million of extra capital funding was promised to the sector in the 2016 autumn statement. Along with extra funding from 2018 for 16-19 T Levels (tech level education) rising to over £500 million per year in 2022 and beyond. Demographic increases in 16-19 students from 2018/19 will also deliver increased funding.

The government have furthermore promised Increased funding for apprenticeships via the Apprenticeship Levy which commenced in May 2017.

As FE is viewed as being central to UK success in addressing the economic and skills challenges, post Brexit, besides the benefits of increased funding for apprenticeships via the apprenticeships Levy.

GMB envisage continuing joint work with the AoC in campaigning for the funding promised by government to the further education sector.

GMB furthermore through the prism of national negotiations will demand apprenticeship schemes for all college staff become an integral part of future GMB bargaining objectives.
