NHS Workers Say NO! (NSN) to Public Sector Pay Inequality

What are the issues?

We were left out of the public sector pay deal announced by the government.

Government ministers clapped us, but won't pay us.

NHS workers have paid a huge COVID cost- many of our colleagues have lost their lives.

Health workers are 20% worse off in real terms than we were 10 years ago.

Most of us are already on the top of our pay bands. This means we only got a 1.7% rise in April.

For the rest of us, increments reflect our experience & CPD, not an **annual cost of living** pay increase.

Low pay and bad staff morale means that there are 100,000 vacancies in the NHS.

Introducing fees means student nurses face huge debts and numbers continue to fall.

The government has used the COVID crisis to push for more privatisation/outsourcing in our NHS.
