GMB LAUNCHES NEW PUBLIC SECTOR PAY CAMPAIGN

GMB CALLS FOR AN END TO PUBLIC SECTOR PAY RESTRAINT

GMB has launched a new national campaign calling for an end to pay restraint and to break the public sector pay cap.

When prices are rising twice as fast as wages it's time to call the Government's 1% cap what it is – a severe cut to people's quality of living.

Many NHS staff have seen their pay increase by just 3% in six years after Jeremy Hunt rode roughshod over the Pay Review Body's recommendations in 2014.

And too many of our members in schools, local government and other public services have been forced to make ends meet as they have seen real term pay cuts for over a decade.

The GMB's new pay campaign says that enough is enough. Public sector workers deserve better. That's why we are calling on the Government to take the following steps:

- No ifs, no buts end public sector pay cuts.
 Public service workers deserve better.
- Proper funding so that everyone gets the services they need, when they need them regardless of their bank balance or postcode.
- Take politics out of public service workers' paylet independent pay review bodies decide what's right, not politicians.
- Pay all public sector workers enough to live on, that means at least £10 an hour.

WHY THE PAY CAP HAS TO END

- Ministers originally said pay would be frozen for one year – but their squeeze on wages has now been extended to a decade
- The real value of public sector workers' pay has declined by around 10% since 2010 as prices outstrip wages
- Inflation is set to go up by twice the 1% cap, further reducing the value of the average public sector salary by £3,300 by 2020
- Most pay scale points have increased by just 3%-4% since 2010 less than half the wage growth in the private sector
- Our public services face acute recruitment shortfalls, but even the Government admits that the pay cap poses 'risks to the NHS ... including recruitment and retention, agency costs and staff morale'
- The Government has already over taken £8 billion out of the economy, holding back growth across the country
- Brexit is pushing up inflation, which alone will cost the average public sector worker over a thousand pounds in real terms by 2020 if the cap is not lifted

PUBLIC SECTOR PAY: WHY IT MATTERS

Theresa May says she wants to help people who are 'just about managing' but that hasn't applied to the five million strong army of essential public sector workers.

Figures compiled by the GMB show how extreme the cuts facing our members have been, and how much they stand to lose if the public sector pay cap is not broken.

Too many services are at breaking point after six years of funding cuts. Our members are shouldering an extremely heavy burden but their contributions are not being valued by the Government where it matters.
